Sharing data with the CIBMTR


As a service to our members to decrease their workload, EBMT has an agreement with the CIBMTR to transfer MED-A data to them should the centre so wish. During the last years, the Registry Office has been working with the CIBMTR to build an automatic transmission system to achieve this.

There are still some technical impediments, but successful submission has been achieved for many transplants, with the emphasis on data from patients transplanted with USA cord blood units. The Registry hopes that full transmission will be possible during 2015.


Introducing ProMISe 3

Data entry layout: ProMISe 2 versus ProMISe 3




Easier access



If you forget your password, you can now request a new one on the logon page. Enter your username and a security code will be emailed automatically to your registered email address


Password requests

Don't forget! - to check that we have your correct email address on the system. This is very important for communications and ProMISe 3 password updates




Emails addresses should be individual rather than team email addresses.


The number of options for transferring data has increased. So you can now copy and paste
