

JOHN HANSEN RESEARCH GRANT

FOR THE STUDY OF HEMATOPOIETIC STEM CELL TRANSPLANTATION
AND CELL THERAPIES OF HEMATOLOGIC MALIGNANCIES



John A. Hansen was a pioneer in the field of stem cell transplantation, unrivaled in his innovative research and persistent promotion for the use of stem cell transplantation as a therapy for blood cancer. The leadership and vision he brought to his role on the DKMS Foundation Board and Medical Council has helped to bring hope to thousands of patients across the world and continues to bring us closer to a future in which every family has a chance to fight for their loved ones.

In honor of John A. Hansen, DKMS provides up to four annual grants to promising and developing researchers to advance the understanding of therapeutic strategies in the context of hematopoietic cell transplantation and cellular therapies for hematologic malignancies.

RESEARCH SCOPE

Proposals must address issues on blood cancer and hematopoietic transplantation. Various aspects may be covered including but not restricted to transplant immunology, stem cell donation, cell manufacturing, diagnostic and therapeutic strategies.

DESCRIPTION

The John Hansen Research Program provides funding for each awardee up to a maximum of **€ 240,000, payable over**

a 3 year period (maximum € 80.000 annually). Each funding year runs from July 1st to June 30th. Up to four projects will be selected from the eligible applications.

QUALIFICATIONS OF RESEARCHERS

Applicants must have a doctoral degree (M.D., Ph.D., or equivalent) in a field pertinent to the award within the past eight years. Applicants do not have to hold a faculty position and can be in training (Fellows, Postdoctoral Fellows and Junior Faculty). Applicants from all countries are invited to submit an application.
