The EBMT announces the 2nd International Transplant Course in Barcelona

Barcelona, 23 August 2017 - The 2nd International Transplant Course (ITC) organised by the European Society for Blood and Marrow Transplantation (EBMT) will take place from the 8th to the 10th of September 2017 in the University of Barcelona, Faculty of Medicine. This three-day course is meant to target mainly young stem cell transplant physicians.

This event is being carefully organised by a team of the EBMT and a panel of specialists in the field of Bone Marrow Transplant and Cellular Therapy. This original cutting-edge program includes sessions that will cover blood diseases-related topics such as: acute myeloid leukaemia; Myelodysplastic–myeloproliferative diseases, acute lymphoblastic leukaemia, Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, myeloma, hemoglobinopathies, severe aplastic anaemia and bone marrow failures, rare complications. The programme also tackles topics such as immune biology and graft engineering (cellular therapy, CAR T-Cells, donor lymphocyte infusion, immunomodulation; HLA principles; haematopoietic stem cell transplantation; infection management; graft-versus-host disease).

The presentations will be delivered by key European leaders in the field including from Spain: Rafael Duarte (Hospital Universitario Puerta de Hierro, Madrid); Alvaro Urbano-Ispizua (Hospital Clinic, Barcelona); Enric Carreras (REDMO, Barcelona); Jordi Sierra (Hospital Santa Creu i Sant Pau, Barcelona); Anna Sureda (Hospital Duran i Reynals, Barcelona).

Professor Mohamad Mohty, President of the EBMT and head of the Haematology department at the Saint-Antoine hospital in Paris highlights that: "The objective of this course fulfills the EBMT's mission that is to disseminate knowledge and advance the field of stem cell transplantation and cellular therapy. The ITC represents a great addition to our educational courses portfolio and an opportunity for exchanging experiences and learning from each other."

Young physicians will have the opportunity to feature their work by presenting clinical case reports. Several reports will be presented in total to illustrate the seminal lectures. The EBMT-ITC is part of a broader initiative, which will encompass the launch of a specific high level "EBMT stem cell transplant physician curriculum". Professor Mohty explains: "This project is currently under construction. Our goal is to prepare the next generation of leaders and experts in the field. This EBMT curriculum will rapidly become a key feature of EBMT achievements as part of our commitment towards delivering state of the art care for our patients."
